The purpose of the workshops, aimed at Administrators, Directors of Care and staff responsible for Infection Prevention and Control (IPAC) Programs in long term care, is to review recommended components of IPAC programs in Long-Term Care facilities based on the Provincial Infectious Diseases Advisory Committee best practice recommendations (2008).
